*RUMOR HAS IT THERE WILL BE
A BOXER TOSS SOON.
READ THIS!!!*

After a very serious accident as a result of the Boxer Toss in the Spring of 1992, the Undergraduate Community Council made the following decisions:

"Due to the concern for Pacific University students' well-being and the need to protect the University from liability, the Boxer Toss cannot be a Pacific University sanctioned event as it now exists.

If a Boxer Toss occurs, it may be necessary for Community Safety & Security to call the Forest Grove Police Department to ensure that endangering behavior does not occur during the Boxer Toss. If the police are called, students participating in the Boxer Toss would be held accountable to Oregon state law (disorderly conduct, reckless endangerment, assault, etc.).

Neither Security nor the Undergraduate Community Council want to involve the police ... this would be a very serious step which might result in students having an arrest record ... something nobody wants. However, after extensive discussion, we feel there is no other choice."

PLEASE THINK SERIOUSLY ABOUT THE CONSEQUENCES OF YOUR ACTIONS BEFORE INITIATING OR PARTICIPATING IN A BOXER TOSS.

The Undergraduate Community Council will discuss the Boxer Toss at their meeting today (Tuesday) at noon in the Milky Way. Please come if you want more information or want to discuss how to make the Boxer tradition a safe one.
