SUBJECT: Cabinet Meeting

Leo Hegstrom -- There is dispute between Health and Human Services with regards to block grants and the amount to be allocated. Should be resolved in a day or two. Starting interviews with the finalists in Senior Citizens Division.

Karen Roach -- New procedures and process in diverting kids to community placement and other appropriate placement will stop rise in training schools by getting kids who don't need close custody into the community. Should see some impact in reduction at Hillcrest and McLaren.

Joe Treleavan -- Moving clients into community. Can fund five counties including Multnomah, Washington and Clackamas and close out beds in state hospitals.

Roy Green -- Received award for Workers Comp Department for fully implementing information system.

Dave Frohnmayer -- Encouraged attendance at Administrative Law Conference next week. Said it should help agencies to cut legal services costs. In process of revising Model Rules of Administrative Procedure and the Open Meetings and Records Manual. Agencies encouraged to give comments on these revisions. Response brief submitted last night on reapportionment. Feels court will uphold. Date for hearing hasn't been set on premium tax issue. Special session -- his office has opinion dated 11/80 which concluded that separation of powers was not sufficient to pose a constitutional challenge to appointment issue. Feels there isn't enough money in the corrections bond measure and counties are going to be competing for money. Money too small to do job that needs to be done.

Roy Lieuallen -- Going to fall short of estimated tuition revenue income -- be a rather large number of dollars. Primarily in foreign students and domestic non-residents. More precise figure in next two-three weeks.

Terry Olson -- Private funds have been raised to set up architect school. Board has approved.
