## The Range of Work

Pacific University prepares students for professional study in many fields—medicine, engineering, theology, social science, business administration, and others.

It also prepares directly for numerous occupations, some of them in the civil service field.

## New Courses

Recently the University arranged with the Montana Deaconess Hospital, Great Falls, Montana, for a joint five-year course. Students will spend three years at the University and two at the Hospital, earning the B.S. degree at Pacific and a diploma in nursing at the Hospital.

The Home-making course is being revised and developed. It is not limited to "home economics," but is integrated with the work in other departments, particularly art, music, psychology, and sociology.

The art department is growing rapidly and co-operating with other departments in related work.

## Special Opportunities

Many opportunities are offered in all departments for exceptional students. For example, in science qualified students are working on research problems.

In journalism many work on college publications and others serve on the staff of the Pacific University News Service, which reaches a large number of newspapers.

## Other Outstanding Departments

The Division of Music is expanding very rapidly. Students may earn a Mus.B. degree or may offer music as a major for the B.A. degree. A number of musical organizations give training and experience in ensemble work.

The teacher training course is outstanding. It prepares for high school teaching in all academic subjects. Physical education courses prepare for high school teaching, recreational leadership, and coaching.

The speech department gives not only basic training in speech, but also many opportunities in forensics contests, in the presentation of plays, in radio writing and performance. It also conducts a speech clinic which serves as a laboratory for prospective teachers of speech.

Other opportunities in the best modern trend are being developed. For example, Pacific is expanding a distinctive program of visual education.

## Campus Life

The students publish a weekly newspaper, The Index; an illustrated annual called the Heart of Oak; and a semi-annual called Pacifica, which publishes distinctive writing by student contributors; and the Freshman Handbook.

Student organizations—fraternities and sororities, service and honorary societies—number fifteen. These, with their interlocking activities and a number of all-college affairs give a rich and varied social life.

## The Campus

With its huge oaks, its redwoods planted by pioneers a century ago, its avenues of birches, and its variety of other trees the campus is a beautiful setting for the vine covered buildings. An athletic field and tennis courts are but two of many recreational facilities.

The only other charges are a small student body fee and a special schedule for private music lessons. Books and supplies may be purchased at the student book store.
