## AUCTION AND SPAGHETTI DINNER - GASTON

The Upper Tualatin Action Group and a large nimber of area citizens are interested in the possibility of having the Gaston Community Hall repaired as a possible future Multi-service Center for the area. The group has had 4 meetings with the Gaston City Council, who has shown interest in the possibility of obtaining funds from the Department of Housing and Urban Development through its Neighborhood Facility Grant Program. If the City Council should finally decide to apply for these funds, one third of the total cost will have to come as the local share.

To make an attempt to come up with this local share, Ralph Rasmussen, member of the Gaston City Council, suggested to the Upper Tualatin Action Group that an Auction might be the way to start. So next Sunday, June 9, 1968 at 1 PM in the Gaston Community Hall is the time and place for the Auction. Chris Christiansen has donated his time as the auctioneer. The Items to be sold are all being donated. A wee calf and horse have already been donated. How about that!

Besides, a Spaghetti Dinner will also be served from 1 PM. So bring your family and have an afternoon of fun, and a hearty meal.

# MEDICAL SELF-HELP TRAINING COURSE - SHERWOOD

In cooperation with Oregon State Board of Health, the Sherwood Area Action Group has arranged for a series of classes on Medical Self-Help. The first meeting will be held on Monday, June 10th at 7:30 PM at the Sherwood Center, which is in the Grange Hall. The series consists of eleven topics and will touch on such areas as artifical Respiration, Bleeding and Bandaging, Burns, Shock, Infant and Child care, Emergency Childbirth, Fractures and Splinting, Etc. The lessons will be taught with filmstrips and motion pectures and will be followed by practice sessions. Mr. John Sellers of the State Board of Health will introduce the course and John has arranged that a student from the Oregon Medical School will complete the training. It is planned that interested people from the other Center areas will participate in this program, and perhaps teach the course in their own Centers at a later date. The course is open to the public and a certificate will be given to those who complete it.

## HEALTH SURVEY AND T.B. TEST CLINIC - TIMBER

For sometime the County Health Department has been conducting a 3-step Health Surve; in the County. The first step was a Block Survey to d termine selected environmental factors related to communicable disease control. These factors include land use; exterior housing quality; water supply; human waste disposal; refuse storage; rubble accumulations; etc. This has been completed by the Health Department Staff. The 2nd part is the Health Interview Survey. This survey will be made through-out the county from July 15-19 and will be a random sampling of families in 4 mejor areas of the county. However, the Health Department has selected the innediate Timber area for a complete door to door survey. Some 50-60 famili s will be interviewed this week. The immunization record and communicable disease history of each family member will be obtained. Then on Saturday, June 8 from 9:30 AM to 12 noon, the Health Dept. will hold a Tubercular Skin Test Clinic at the Timber Center. It is hoped that the entire Population of the Timber area will participate. At a future date it is planned to hold a TB Clinic and this time have the same people Z-Rayed. This is a pilot program and future planns will be based on the outcome.

The 3rd part of the Health Survey will be <u>ACTION</u>. Efforts will be made to provide the health services that the survey will indicate as needed.

### FAMILY PLANNINS CLINIC

In recent months the attendance at the clinic has jumped. The Doctor and the Nurse have been kept very busy. The clinic is held at the Health Department at 3rd Ave. in Hillsboro the 3rd Tuesday of each month - June 11 - this month - beginning at 7:30 rM.
