Governor Arios

Revenue - Rich working on a project for Governor so not in attendance. Hearing next week on Rajneesh church. Wasco Co. had denied tax exemption.

<u>Austin</u> - Meeting with Institute of Real Estate and Management to work toward a management agreement for empty Vets Home.

E. Board approved release of Boeing property to Port of Morrow.

Pictures for Governor of monument at Valley Forge.

Attached is Vets annual report.

Bellamy - Chief Justice now supportive of DUI situation.

Traffic fatalities up by 7. July and August unusually high with 20% of fatalities being non-residents. Special program being explored.

Maul - Town Hall show on Ballot Measure 2. Average retirement benefit \$1400 per month was an erroneous statement by proponents. 1965 - \$51, 1983 - \$313 are actual figures. Statement was taken from a pamphlet that shows those with 30 years of service receive \$1400 average. That amounts to about 600 people.

Jan. 1981 -- 800 plus employers participating in trust. This year 20 more have been added.

SMA annual meeting set for Dec. 6 at Red Lion, Jantzen Beach. Barbara Roberts will keynote. Mark Nelson will discuss Oregon's economy and political future. Governor will be banquet speaker.

Had called for press conference at 3:00 p.m. Were late in arriving and press had left. GA's met with Col. Pankratz.

The first federally funded sobriety checkpoint held last weekend. Several others over the years but not federally funded.

Williams announced his change of mind about retirement the end of this year. Says he may become "senior superintendant."

Discussed communication background over the weekend re: Rajneesh. Apparently there was a retirement party for Major Lambkin in central Oregon which caused a lack of attention to information. Superintendent not very happy. I assured Williams that although the breakdown was unfortunate, overall communication superb.

Lockwood - complimented OSP's handling of Rjaneesh situation.

Two Air Guard officers died of asphyxiation in a private camper.

Oliver commended guard's help with voting process in Wasco County.
