

Since 1993, the Oregon Housing and Community Services Excellence Awards Program has recognized individuals and organizations that have made extraordinary contributions to help their friends and neighbors who are the most in need. These individuals are the cornerstone of our communities by ensuring that all of our citizens in Oregon, regardless of income, have fair and open access to housing and the necessary supportive services to meet their daily needs.

These efforts should not go without recognition. We look to our partners and others to nominate these individuals and organizations that consistently make a difference. No effort is too small or inconsequential. Help us celebrate these successes and accomplishments by nominating them for the 2008 Excellence Award Program.

Nominations will be accepted through August 15, 2008. Award recipients will be announced during the 2008 Oregon Housing and Community Services Conference in Salem on October 6-8, 2008.

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Categories

Excellence in Affordable Housing Awards

The Excellence in Affordable Housing Awards recognizes the achievements of developments, initiatives, organizations and individuals whose efforts have increased the availability or preservation of affordable housing and the necessary support services for lower-income individuals in Oregon.

Best New Affordable Housing of the Year - Awarded to a builder, developer, sponsor, or housing project that exemplifies quality affordable housing in an urban or rural area, incorporates the fundamental supportive services, and utilizes green construction or other elements that makes it environmentally sustainable.

Partner of the Year - Awarded to a builder, developer, sponsor, or other individual/organization who demonstrates a high level of expertise, a measurement of quality performance, ability to listen closely to clients, bring together the involved stakeholders and has a commitment to sustainability.

Commitment to Special Needs Housing -

Awarded to a builder, developer, sponsor, project, or other individual/organization who demonstrates an ongoing commitment to serve the special needs population. Two awards are presented in this category: Small Developments (10 or fewer units) and Large Developments (more than 10 units).

Preservation of Affordable Housing - Awarded to a developer, sponsor, project, or individual/organization who demonstrates an ongoing commitment to preserving affordable housing.

The following criteria may be considered during the evaluation process for the Excellence in Affordable Housing Awards:

- Specific project construction development costs (other than land).
- Steps taken to mitigate costs.
- The term of affordability (years).
- The extent of affordability (% of AMI).
- The development is completed and tenant-occupied.
- The quality of the project design and site planning.
- Involvement of a public/private partnership.
- Use of regulatory reform to reduce development costs.

- Leverage of public, private, and nonprofit funds in the development of the project.
- The inclusion of energy efficiency savings.
- Use or support of sustainable green construction and land development practices.
- Inclusion of innovative building technologies and systems that reduce cost and/or improve quality.
- The value of the project as a model worthy of emulation.
- The inclusion of tenant services.
- Demonstrated oversight to ensure the ongoing physical and financial viability of a development.

*At-Large Excellence Awards

The At-Large Excellence Awards recognize, encourage and promote the significant contributions that organizations and individuals make to improve the lives of lower-income people in Oregon.

Management Company of the Year - Awarded to a management company or individual who shows a commitment to maintain the ongoing quality of an affordable housing development, ensures the ongoing financial viability of the development, provides first rate service to tenants, and demonstrates a commitment to improve services.

Tenant Services of the Year - Awarded to an organization, individual, or project that demonstrates a commitment to tenant involvement and participation, identifies and monitors tenant needs and encourages integrated communities.

Lender of the Year - Awarded to a financial organization that demonstrates a commitment to provide opportunities for low-income or at-risk Oregonians to own their own

homes, provides programs or assistance to individuals as an alternative to foreclosure, or is instrumental in the financing of single family loans through the Oregon Bond Program.

Community-Based Organization of the Year - Awarded to a community action agency, food pantry, or other non-profit, grass roots organization who demonstrates a commitment to help economically challenged Oregonians obtain health, education, or other basic human services, which exemplifies good fiscal management practices, shows a dedication to improving the quality of local community programs designed to meet specific needs, and responds to the needs of their clients.

Special Excellence Award

Director's Choice Award - Presented to a builder, sponsor, service organization, or other individual/organization for their contribution to affordable housing, to providing training and job opportunities for local residents, ensuring a mix of tenants, incorporating elements of sustainable development into the project and the community, or a demonstrated record of success in bringing significant change to an area. The recipient of this award will be selected by the Director of Oregon Housing and Community Services.
