

FORMER INDIAN STUDENT  
REVISITS FOREST GROVE

Albert John, a Umatilla Indian, better known by his adopted name of Albert Minthorn, visited S. A. Walker in this city, Saturday. Mr. Minthorn is a wealthy farmer living on the Umatilla reservation in Eastern Oregon. When Indian school was located here, he was a student in the school, and went from here to Salem when the institution was moved to the capital city in 1885, where he completed the course and then returned to his allotment of land on the reservation.

Mr. Minthorn, previous to his visit here Saturday, had not been in Forest Grove since 1885, and he stated that the only thing that looked familiar to him was the college campus. The town was but a village when he left twenty-seven years ago, and most of the old land marks are now replaced by modern buildings.
