Commerce: Heard in Roseburg at Business Climate Conference. Three-part series will be run in Daily Journal of Commerce about Commerce Dept.

Munn: Spoke to Tax Administrators Association. Had many concerns about unitary tax which Rich will share with Governor upon his return. Big week for tax returns. Single biggest error in returns is the \$85 credit — leaving it off. Another problem is local post office which has become very slow in processing. Interim Revenue Committee this week will receive testimony from fellow from North Dakota who is a strong advocate of unitary tax. Kent court case which deals with rights to appeal needs to be discussed with Governor. Situation is hold up of funds (total amount) until decision to appeal is determined. Rich Munn needs to see the Governor about two court cases.

Veterans' Affairs: Austin out of town. Move into new building still on schedule.

Bellamy: Review some federal brochures pertaining to DUII.

McGoffin: Media list of retirees will be available to Governor's office. HB 4170 (TEFRA bill) to be discussed on floor of House week before Easter.

Emergency Management: Hardy visiting Lake County which is having similar problems to Harney County.

Dean Smith: Concern about federal excise tax being promoted by Congress. Private club rule is being reviewed for radical change as it relates to members and their guests. Large groups could get a special \$25 permit to serve mixed drinks. Profits would go to host or club, at their own decision. Coors coming into Eugene area legally on April 17. By kegs (tavern) or one gallon can to go. At bar 12 oz. bottle or 12 oz. can. All is unpasteurized. Law allows for this size container. Jim Markee and Roger Martin hired to promote state lottery and are asking that OLCC agents be allowed to distribute petitions. Agents will be angry if refused but commission will rule.

General Services: No report.

OSP: Superintendent attending mother's funeral. Missing women issue being reviewed by all local police agencies. Eleven detectives assigned to case. Also other investigators from outside state have been brought in to assist. Females driving alone should be extremely cautious.

General Miller: Move toward state defense services designed to assist National Guard if called to active duty. General signed agreement for Reserve to provide security for energy producing plants.

Bob Smith: Major economists project recession in 1985 — unavoidable no matter what Congress or President does.
