Thorough instruction in Shorthand and Typewriting by an experienced instructor. This together with a short course in Bookkeeping and such studies as Grammer, Arithmetic and Spelling provides a practical business course.

Tuition for either Shorthand or Typewriting is \$5.00 per term. If both are taken together the tuition is \$7.50 per term, including use of machine.
