The Clark claim was first taken by Ovis Brown who crossed the plains, on horseback with the great migration in 1843. He (Brown) took the claim in early fall of 1843, raised a crop in 1844, sold the claim to Rev. Harvey Clark in spring of 46 for 500 bushels of wheat to be delivered to Brown -
