

SITE OF ORIGINAL BUILDING


## LOCATION

Pacific University is located at Forest Grove, a town of about seventeen hundred population, twenty-six miles west of Portland, on the west side division of the Southern Pacific Railroad. It is reached by two trains daily from each direction, and it is expected that transportation facilities will soon be increased by the running of a motor and by the construction of an electric line from Portland.

Forest Grove is a healthful and beautiful location for a college, and combines the advantages of a small town and country surroundings with the opportunities of a large city not far distant.


STUDY ROOM IN HERRICK HALL

## COURSES OF STUDY


Students are admitted to the college from High Schools and Academies having a four-years' course of study.

## EQUIPMENT

The College possesses a library of over 13,000 volumes, which is one of the best in the State. In some lines it is particularly full and offers good facilities for research work on the part of students. Department libraries in connection with the different departments place books within easy access. Laboratories for chemistry and biology are adequate for the courses in science. A conservatory of music and art department provide facilities along those lines.



COLLEGE CAMPUS





## EXPENSES

Expenses are comparatively low, and it is estimated that the average of necessary expense ranges from a minimum of \$200 a year to a maximum of \$400. There are many opportunities for self help. Tuition is \$15 a term and an incidental fee of \$2 is charged. Good rooms can be secured at \$1 to \$2 a week, and board at \$2 to \$3 a week. Young women can secure room and board at Herrick Hall, a homelike dormitory, at \$3 to \$4, according to the location of the room.

## STUDENT ACTIVITIES

All of the student activities are represented and the facilities for a healthful and attractive student life outside of the classroom work are encouraged. Three literary societies, two for the men and one for the women, furnish advantages for society work; much attention is given to debating and inter-society and inter-class debates, prepared under the guidance of a trained instructor, are frequent. Branches of the Young Men's and the Young Women's Christian Associations give opportunity for moral and religious culture and are a helpful feature of a college life. A college weekly is maintained by the students. Athletics receive their share of attention. Football and track athletics are pursued with competent coaches and instructors. The college possesses a four-lap running track and a gymnasium. Basket ball is played during the season. The Choral Union and other musical societies offer opportunities along those lines. A Social Union provides several meetings yearly for mutual acquaintance between students and faculty.
