### PREFACE

For several years the Legislative Counsel's staff has tabulated statistics of certain aspects of legislative activity during sessions of the Legislative Assembly. This report presents, in tabular form, a statistical summary of that activity during the 1969 regular session and compares it with similar activity during the 1963, 1965 and 1967 regular sessions.

Some of the totals and percentages in the tables were reconciled when there were discrepancies in the source materials. However, no such adjustment was of a significant nature.
