Much concern is being expressed about the Council and its soon-to-be weakness.

Upcoming resignations are:

- 1. Al Hampson feels he should resign because of his recent appointment to the Regional Power Council.
- 2. Brother Raphael Wilson will not be returning to Oregon and cannot personally afford the trip from San Francisco to Oregon for each Council meeting.
- 3. Harvey Risewick has just indicated he wants off the Council.

Al Hampson suggests that all three appointments be made at the same time and postponed until after the Special Session. Al is willing to continue serving until his replacement is appointed but would resign immediately upon any criticism.

Lynn Frank et al are very concerned about the pending appointments and the caliber of chosen people. There is a strong need for strength.

Suggested candidates are:

Phil Schneider (needs to be talked into an appointment to come back on the Council).

Ned Clark (Salem attorney -- strong and willing to stand up and be counted).

Mary Ellen Marmaduke (a Democrat and environmentalist. Al Hampson's recommendation, but he feels she should be checked out more thoroughly.)

Dr. Grace Phinney (served on the Alternate Energy Commission. Was a quiet member, but thoughtful and effective.)

Jack Frost (another Al Hampson recommendation. Al suspects Jack, for some reason or another, is persona non grata with Governor. Al feels he wuld be good for the Council.)
