#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

<u>PURPOSE</u> - In the spirit of the sister state-province agreement being established between the State of Oregon and the Fujian Province, we wish to establish a long-term relationship that will be mutually beneficial to the economic, Technical, and academic areas of forestry and forest products. this will accomplished by opening a direct line of communication for the exchange of technology and educational information and developing and enhancing mutual trade relations in forestry related areas.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES - The following areas have been targeted for specific action:

- Investigation of sawmill equipment and technology required for projects planned for the Shaowu storage and the Xiamen Special Economic Zone.

- Hardwood drying technology required for the Shunchang storage project.

- Equipment desired for upgrading and modernization the knookdown furniture section of the Fuzhou woodworking factory. - Design and development of the Jianou heavy kraft paper factory. - Fujian has agreed to consider the importation Oregon sawn timber products.

- Preferred forms of cooperation for these projects are listed by priority as follows. Joint venture, Compensation trade, Coproduction and importation of Technology and Equipment.

REPORT OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON TRADE DEVELOPMENT; FUJIAN PROVINCE, STATE OF OREGON; SEPTEMBER 25, 1984

In the hope of promoting friendly cooperation and creating a mutually beneficial trading relationship between the State of Oregon and the Province of Fujian, an agreement establishing a sister stateprovince relationship has been signed. To facilitate the exchange of economic, cultural, and educational opportunities between Oregon and Fujian as envisioned in the agreement, this committee has met.

The committee of representatives from Fujian and Oregon discussed the following:

1. Problems creating barriers to prester import and export trading;

2. Necessary information to assist in evaluating trading potential:

3. Infrastructure capabilities of ports, railroads, and highways;

4. Organizational structure of government sgencies which have responsibility for trade;

5. Cultural, language, political, business, and geographic differences which affect trade relations.

As a result of the discussions the committee agreed to recommend to the governors of Oregon and Fujian the following:

1. An Oregon State Bureau be established in Fujian Province, and a Fujian Province Bureau be established in Oregon, as part of the governmental estimature of each:

2. An intern exchange pro raw be established, where individuals from Fujian and Oregon will be sent to their counterpart state/province. Those individuals, on their return, would work in the respective sureau within their country;

3. Methods to enhance communications between prospective importers and exporters of each state/province will be explored and formal proposals will be submitted after establishment of the bureaus; 4. An organization chart showing the structure of the bureauoracy of each state/ province be created;

5. A list of banking relationships and possibilities be prepared by each state/province;

Information relating to ports and herbors located in
Oregon and Fujian be exchanged;

7. Narketing assistance be given by each state/province to enhance product exporting possibilities;

8. Trade at sions between Oregon and Fujien should be encouraged, facilitated, and supported by the povernments of each state/province;

9. An exchange of trade fairs displaying Fujian products in Oregon and Ore on products in Fujian should be established;

10. Each state/province shall actively tork to identify and educate as to possible export, joint venture, and manufacturing opportunities;

11. An active publicity program concerning the Oregon/Fujian sister state/ sister province agreement should be pursued.
