

TRUSTEE REPRESENTATIVE

This spring it was suggested to the Alumni Board that it might be possible for the Alumni Association to have an official representative on the Board of Trustees.

Area groups were asked to submit the names of candidates. The Southern California group nominated Dr. Charles E. Bradley, '97. The Portland group submitted the name of Lawrence Jolma, '39. These candidates were presented to the dues paying members on a post card ballot. Space was provided for write-in candidates.

Results of the balloting showed Jolma to be the favorite with 97 votes and Bradley followed with 49. Two write-in ballots were cast for Pete Miller, '30, and one each for Frank Brodersen, '45, and Hamilton Brown, '30.

The results of the election were turned over to the Nominating Committee of the Board of Trustees

at their regular meeting April 23. A short time later Pres. Giersbach announced that Jolma's name had been approved by the Committee and would be presented to the Board of Trustees at their meeting June 2.

If Mr. Jolma is acceptable to the Board of Trustees at that time he will then become the first official representative of the Alumni Association on the Board of Trustees.

Promise that Boxer will return to the campus here by next fall was made recently in a letter received by the Index, and signed only "Boxer."

The letter, which was postmarked "Warrenton, Va." may or may not be authentic, but it adds to the long list of clues which have circulated around the campus since the

dog disappeared more than two years ago.

One strange incident of the letter was the dating of the letter, April 23, 1948, while the Postal date was May 3. At the bottom of the letter was supposedly an imprint of Boxer's paw.

The letter read in full:

dear editor of the pacific index:
I'm terribly sorry that I've been stuck for so long in a place where I couldn't write, but I wanted you to know that I am once again with friends. I hadn't been in this part of the country for many years, but i am already getting rather homesick for the badgers.

i'll be back on campus by fall anyhow, and i'll have a picture taken soon and send to you so you'll know where i am and whom i'm with.

please excuse the typing. both my front legs are still stiff from that last welding.
