We need to reach decisions on the Japan/China trip as soon as possible. Many of the issues need full discussion with you. Denny and I are scheduled to meet with you 7/12, Thursday at 10:00 a.m.

1. Itinerary:

Depart Portland UAL to Tokyo - Tues., Sept 4 - Wed., Sept 5 Arrive Tokyo 9/15 9/5 thru Stay Tokyo -Sept 16 Depart Tokyo -Sept 16 Arrive Beijing -9/16 thru 9/22 Stay Beijing/Fujian Sept 23 Depart Beijing/Fujian Sept 23 Arrive Singapore

Stay Singapore 9/23 thru 9/26
Depart Singapore Sept 26
Arrive Portland Sept 26

Itinerary is choice of Governor. Flights etc., need to be confirmed by EDD.

Channel 2 is not expected to go because they have just returned from China.

NOTE: As much coverage as possible is absolutely necessary. Previous coverage of the Mideast trip has established amazement in other Governors' offices and states. We need to keep the positive momentum and coverage for the Governor, the state and future economic development efforts.
