#### GENERAL FUND EXPENDITURE PATTERNS

The following charts illustrate the growth in State General Fund expenditures over a ten-year period, beginning with the 1973-75 biennium. These charts show General Fund expenditures by major program area and the impact that inflation has had on the State General Fund budget in recent years. During this ten-year period, total General Fund expenditures more than doubled with most of this growth occurring from 1973 to 1979. In 1978, public sentiment to limit the growth of government expenditures was expressed in the form of ballot measures which would have limited the ability of local government to increase property taxes. While these ballot measures were not approved by the voters, the Governor's Recommended Budget for the 1979-81 biennium reflected a strong commitment to hold the line on state government growth and provided for substantial increases in direct tax relief. The Governor's recommended tax relief plan was not adopted in its entirety, but the 1979 Legislature doubled the proportion of State General Fund revenues devoted to direct property tax relief. Since July 1980, the state has faced a series of General Fund revenue shortfalls as a result of the severe national recession and its impacts on Oregon.

The first chart displays State General Fund expenditures over a six-biennia period in four broad program categories -- agency operations and all other aid to local governments and individuals, aid to school districts and community colleges, property tax relief, and agencies not subject to executive branch budgetary control (legislative, judicial, Secretary of State, and State Treasurer). This chart illustrates the steady growth which occurred in all major programs during the 1973-75 through the 1977-79 biennia. The major commitment which was made to increase property tax relief began in 1979. The original legislatively approved budget for the 1981-83 biennium generally maintained the same distribution of State General Fund expenditures among programs, with a slight increase in the proportion of the budget for agencies not subject to executive branch budget control. This reflects the first six months of the phasein of state assumption of county court costs. Special Session expenditure reductions during the 1981-83 biennium affected all program areas, but these cuts fell most heavily on agency operations and

non-educational aid to local government expenditures. The Governor's Recommended Budget for the 1983-85 biennium provides a modest increase over the 1981-83 legislatively approved expenditure level and includes an increase in the portion of the budget which is not subject to executive branch control because of the state assumption of county court costs. The portion of the budget devoted to property tax relief reflects the Governor's commitment to limit property tax increases through separate legislation and his recommendation to grant property tax relief payments only to those with a family income of \$30,000 a year or less. The increase shown in agency operations and other aid to local governments is a result of restoration of temporary salary and program cuts made in 1981-83 and the Governor's commitments to improve higher education, economic development, and public safety programs.

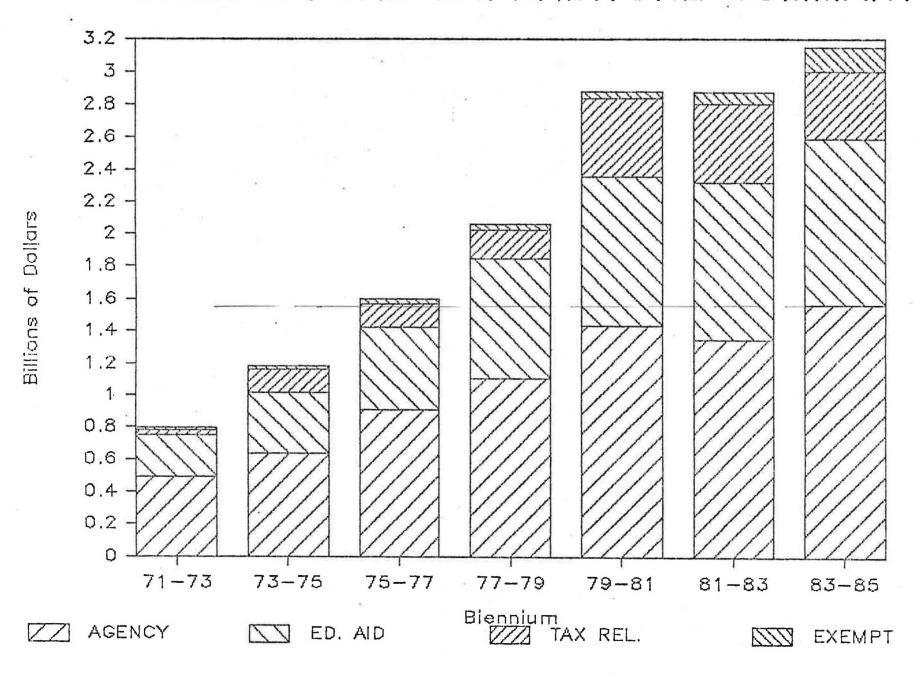

#### DEFLATED GENERAL FUND EXPENDITURE SUMMARY

The attached table and chart display an analysis of General Fund expenditures by program area since the 1973-75 biennium. These expenditure figures have been deflated, using the 1973-75 Portland Consumer Price Index. This means that the figures have been adjusted to eliminate the effects of increases in the Consumer Price Index since the base period of 1973-75. The figures shown portray the actual purchasing power of the General Fund dollars appropriated to various state programs since that time.

Conclusions that can be drawn from this information include:

- There has been little change in total General Fund spending since the 1977-79 biennium when the impact of inflation is taken into account.
- When only the agency operating portion of the budget is considered, the purchasing power of the General Fund is at its lowest point since the 1973-75 biennium.
- The only program area which shows an increase since the high period of 1979-81 is the category of Exempt from Executive Control. (This includes the legislative and judicial branches of government and the Secretary of State and Treasurer of State.)
- The dramatic increase in expenditures in the exempt category is a result of the state assumption of court costs.
- Even though the state has cut back expenditures for property tax relief since the high achieved in the 1979-81 biennium, deflated expenditures for tax relief are still higher than they were in 1977-79.

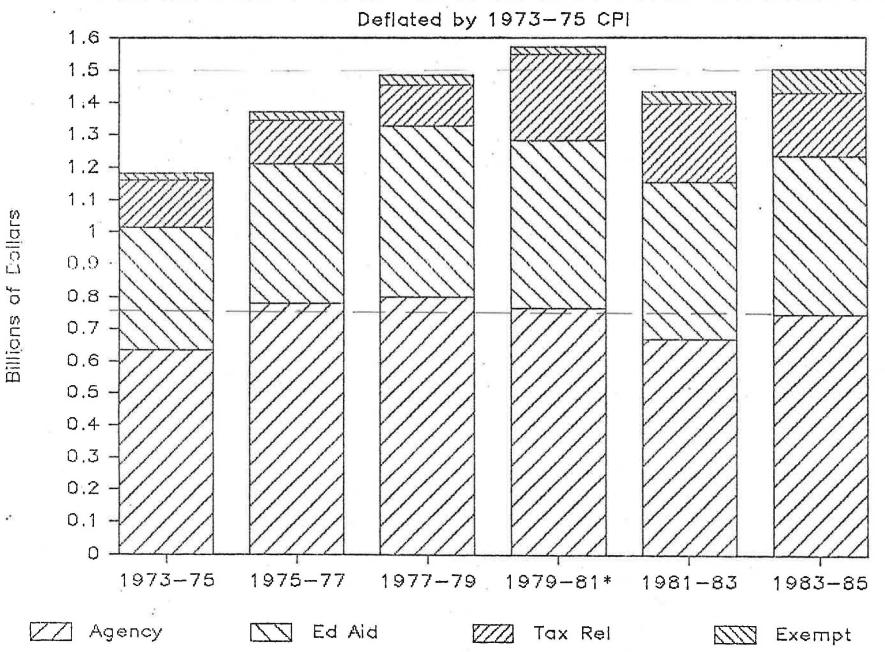

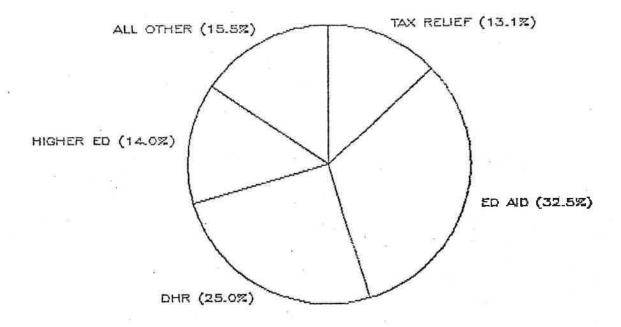

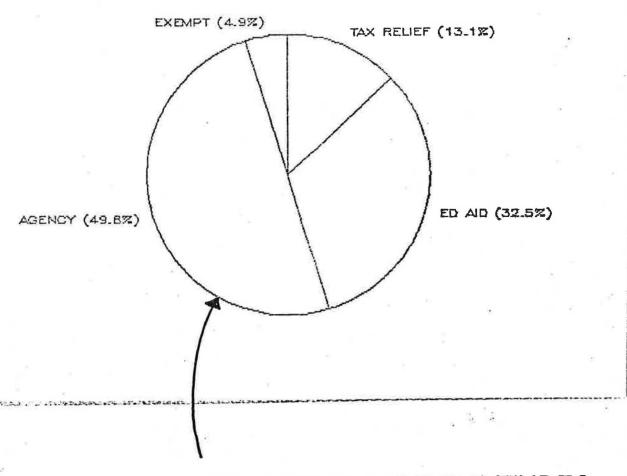

General Fund Expenditures 1983-85



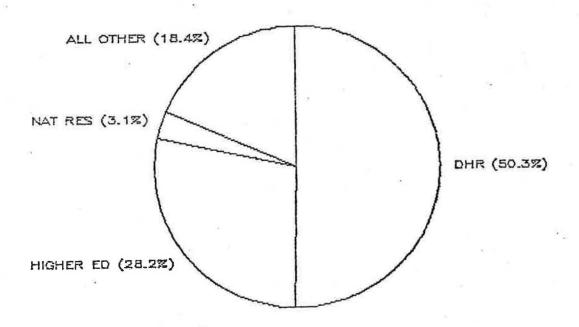

General Fund Expenditures 1983-85



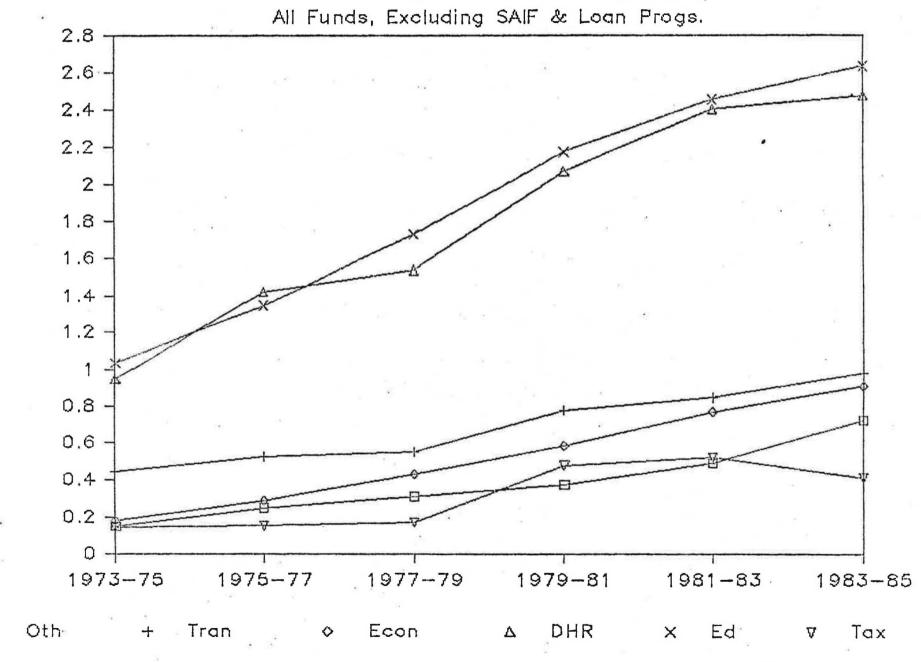

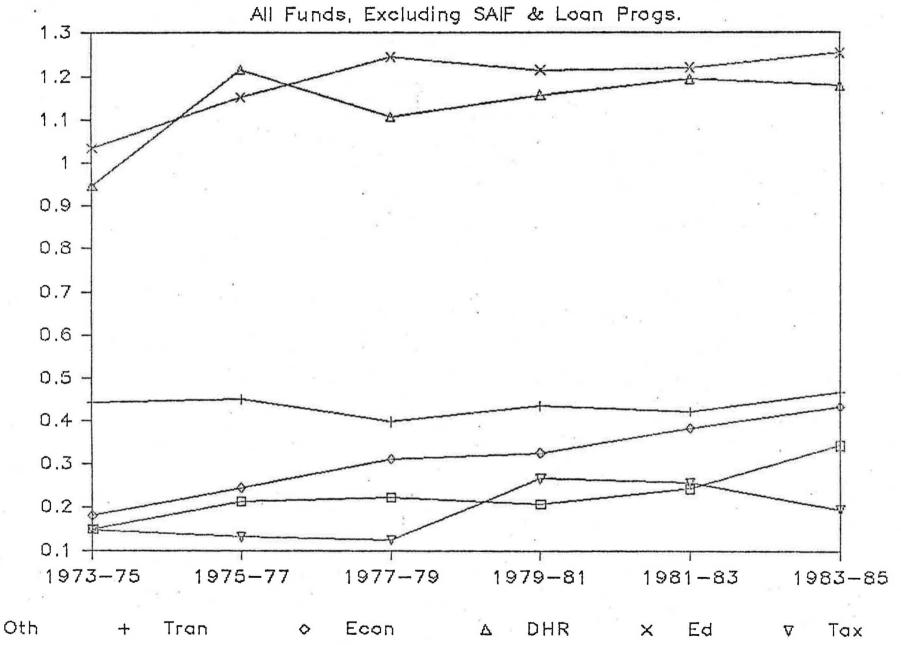
