2-1-1 Progress Report:

How's the Portland/Vancouver metro area 2-1-1 call center doing, you ask? It is humming right along, and thanks for asking. In the last 16 months 211*info* has merged the resource information from four counties and the statewide SafeNet (maternal and child health) program into one huge database, and it has more than quadrupled its staff and office space. They are now taking 2-1-1 calls from two counties (Multnomah and Clackamas) and answering the regular I&R phone line for Clark County. Additionally, they respond to SafeNet calls from all over the state, and take calls from persons who can't access Housing Connections (www.housingconnections.org) over the internet. They are answering an average of 325 calls per day.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT

On September 22nd about 425 preschool children began services in 25 Head Start Pre-K, Part-Day classrooms all over Washington County. We have a new site at W L Henry Elementary school, where we run an AM and PM classroom. Three elementary schools in Tigard-Tualatin school district, including the Head Start classrooms have moved to their new state-of-the-art facilities.

The Child Development Centers have already been up and running since September 7. The Early Head Start classrooms now have mixed age groups in order to meet the needs of the community.

The before and after school care services at A Kids Domain sites started on September 8 and the enrollment at all four sites has been steadily progressing towards being full!

The Screening Fairs for children enrolled in Head Start are now in session at various locations in the County. At these screening fairs, children receive hearing, vision, speech, dental and medical screenings that are required by Head Start.

SAFETY

We recently received a report from SAIF, our Worker's Comp. insurer, that shows the number of accidents in 2002 exceeded the normal (or expected rate of 17) by 6 for a total of 23; again in 2003 we exceeded the normal (or expected rate of 15) by 3 for a total of 18. For 2004 first qtr. we are at expectation of 3. The increasing frequency of accidents plus the amount of lost time paid, impacted our annual rate by increasing it an est. \$9,000. Being vigilant around the workplace will prevent injuries and prevention is the best policy. Identify and fix potential hazards before someone is injured; follow your training for lifting, etc. This year let's all work on eliminating accidents in the work place.
