Dear Governor:

I am writing you on behalf of the Oregon Seed Trade Association, requesting your assistance during your official visit early in September to Japan.

Please find enclosed a copy of a resolution passed by the Oregon Seed Trade Association; also passed by the Pacific Seedsmens Association; and forwarded to the American Seed Trade Association (A.S.T.A.).

The A.S.T.A. Phytosanitary Committee recently concluded a meeting in Washington, D.C. with U.S. Department of Agriculture and APHIS The Phytosanitary section of the U.S.D.A. The O.S.T.A. resolution was discussed and was considered to be the most worthwhile proposal. APHIS advised they would present this proposal to their Japanese counterparts at their next meeting (which we understand is also in September).

Therefore, Governor, the O.S.T.A. respectfully request, you bring this matter before the appropriate Japanese agency officials and request their support of this proposal during your meeting with them.

The O.S.T.A. has also requested as an alternative to the pretest method of Quarantine Inspection, as covered by the resolution, the Japanese government station a permanent Quarantine Inspector in Oregon, who could sample and approve or disapprove prior to shipment for Japanese quarantine requirements.

We are therefore offering two proposals; one pretest seed officially sampled as covered by the resolution or a Japanese Quarantine Inspector stationed in Oregon. Either method would alleviate most of the problems now in effect on seed shipments to Japan.
