- Living in Tigard.
- Husband, Roy M. Tregaskis, drafted 10/10/50 → see Angus  
served time in Germany (not Korea)
- Don't remember beginning of the war, not overly concerned,  
"our boys are over there"
- Husband in Germany, therefore → Didn't have a lot to do  
with it (war) couldn't do anything about it. Tried not  
to worry too much about it. ~~not in danger~~
- Children born in 1951, 1954 → Husband gone for first. Not  
too happy about it.
- A lot more concern for soldiers in WWII than in Korean War  
wanted to "just get it over with"  
"Soldiers shouldn't have been there"
- Don't remember civil defense → remember some demonstrations,  
but wasn't involved with.
- Don't know why → we were there.  
→ what started it.  
→ how we got in.
- Didn't like it, wish that we weren't in it  
"shouldn't have been in it"
- Korean War didn't affect her life (other than husband  
not being home).  
"That was an unhappy time for us, but  
life went on as normally would"
- Feelings About Korean War: "Why go so far, then stop?"  
"Not a war they should be proud of I don't think"  
"Why won't they let them go in and clean  
the whole place out?"  
"Didn't believe that it affected the normal people"  
"Weren't getting anywhere"  
"Why are we there?"
