## **Community Support Restores Building**

Repairs to Community Action's multi-service center are finished! After four-and-a-half months of major construction, we are pleased to announce that the building, located at 1001 SW Baseline St., is fully restored.

Thanks to the diligent work of our dedicated employees, services to our community were only slightly disrupted during the heavy construction.

The building began failing due to significant water penetration. The original construction of the building, completed in 1995, was not adequate to keep moisture out.

Problems deep inside the building had been occurring, undetected, for several years. The same siding that was applied to Community Action's building failed on at least 15 other structures in Hillsboro. The final cost of repairs to our building is \$928,000.

In less than four months, Community Action succeeded in securing nearly \$350,000 toward repair costs. Many grant proposals are still pending.

We are very grateful for a donation of more than \$30,000 in cash and construction materials from Keith Green Construction. Keith's support for Community Action gave the fundraising campaign an important jump-start.

Foundations provided significant assistance for the project. The Collins Foundation was first to step forward with a grant of \$50,000, followed by The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation contributing \$100,000.

The Washington County Office of Community Development eliminated barriers to allow Community Action to pursue financial remedies. Columbia Community Bank provided an outstanding financing package to help manage the costs of the repair.

Most importantly, Community Action's multi-service center is now restored and ready to help the most vulnerable members of our community for years to come. We are grateful to all contributors and volunteers for being part of Community Action's success.



# Community Action Confronts The Economics of Poverty:

Community Action services reach to all areas of Washington County, Oregon. Between July 1, 2003 and June 30, 2004 we responded to over 32,000 requests serving nearly 14,000 families.



Over 1,000 volunteers provided 16,000 hours of service.

# Helping People to Help Themselves

Poverty is a problem that can't be solved without the right variables. Community Action assists families to solve the equation: helping people to meet their basic needs today and providing the tools, resources and education to change their lives for a better tomorrow. We know that families can't have hope if their most basic needs aren't met and having hope is essential so that real change can happen.

Change often begins with the next generation. With that in mind, our programs promote the birth of healthy babies, reduce the risk of child abuse and neglect, increase the probability for pre-schoolers' success in school and increase the quality of child care and its accessibility.




55 homeless families found temporary shelter and support in our Hillsboro shelter.




