## Do you live in Washington County? Take this quiz to find out how much you know about your neighbors!

420,000 people live in Washington County. How many live in poverty? Approximately 60,000 fellow residents of Washington County struggle to meet their basic needs for food, shelter, and heat. *(US Census, 2000; based on 150% of federal poverty level)* 

## Which group makes up the largest recipients of welfare in Oregon?

Children receive 69% of federal assistance dollars (called Temporary Assistance to Needy Families) also know as "welfare". (Department of Human Services, 2000)

Which is more expensive: child care or college tuition? Child care costs, in the metro region, are now more than the cost of annual public college tuition at a state institution: \$4,723 per child vs. average of \$3,407 per student. (United Way, 2003; based on annual tuition at a state institution)

What is the average rent in Washington County? According to the National Low-income Housing Coalition, over 47% of renters in Washington County are currently unable to afford the fair market rent for a 2-bedroom apartment. (Average rent for a two-bedroom apartment is \$730.) (National Low-income Housing Coalition, 2002)

## How many families living in poverty work for a paycheck?

Seventy percent of your neighbors who live in poverty bring home a paycheck. In fact, less than 12% of Oregon's poor receive federal assistance. But working isn't enough. For example, a single parent working full time at a minimum wage job will earn less than the federal poverty level.
