The Assoc<sup>n</sup> elected by ballot, for  
Moderator, Rev. E. Walker; Secretary  
Rev. D. S. Knight. Moderator elect on  
taking the chair opened the Assoc<sup>n</sup> with  
religious exercises. The following Com-  
mittees were then appointed;

Rev. S. V. Blakeslee of the Cong' l Assoc<sup>n</sup>  
of California, was received as <sup>corresponding</sup> member  
of the Ass'n.

Rev. Richard Wyllie of Oregon  
Presbytery (A.S) and Rev. J. S. Wyllie of  
the Presbytery of Benicia Cal., were invited to  
sit as Corresponding members.

Communications were called for and  
Bro. Blakeslee offered the congratulations

and fraternal greetings of the California Ass'n. Rev. G. H. Atkinson made statements in regard to the Maine Conference and other eastern bodies. A communication from the Ass'n of Missouri was read.

Prof. A. G. Harpending of Pacific University, was invited to sit as an honorary member.

After prayer by Rev. S. V. Blakeslee, adjourned.

### Afternoon Session

Voted - That the Ass'n spend one hour in remarks and prayers touching the objects of this Ass'n. Remarks were made by Rev. G. H. Atkinson D.D., and Revs H. Lyman, O. Dickinson, and Bro. Wade.

Rev. S. V. Blakeslee gave an interesting account of the work being done by churches of our order in California.

Voted - That the officers of the Ass'n be authorized to give certificates to any member visiting other bodies in correspondence with us.

Voted - That Rev. F. S. Knight be deputed to visit the Ass'n of California.

Voted - That the hour from 9 to 10 A.M. tomorrow be devoted to narratives of churches.

Committee on church building had reported the sum of \$211.80 raised during the year. Report was accepted.

~~Resolved~~ - That the Cong' l Union be requested to appropriate a portion of their fund to aid in the building of churches in Oregon.

Bro. Gray presented a petition from the Cong' l Church of Astoria to become a member of this Ass'n. The communication was received, and on motion the church at Astoria was duly associated.

The Cong' l church at Hillsborough also petitioned for membership, and was duly received.

On motion the report was made the special order from 9 o'clock to 10 o'clock AM tomorrow.

Rev. A. Dickinson, and Bro's Q. W. Terry and P. M. Carpenter were continued as committee on church building.

The subject of Education was made the special order from 11 to 12 o'clock tomorrow.

June 22<sup>d</sup> 1844

Ass'n met and was opened by religious  
exercises.

Minutes of yesterday were read and  
approved.

Narratives of churches being called  
for, the delegates and pastors of different  
churches made brief statements.

The narratives occupied the time of the  
ass'n for two hours, after which the  
report of the Com. on Destitution and Supply  
was taken up and discussed.

On motion it was  
voted - that a Home Missionary Committee  
of three be appointed with authority to elect  
a Chairman and Treasurer.

The following resolution  
was unanimously adopted:

"Resolved - That this Ass'n  
heartily endorse the recommendation of the  
late Cong'c Council to the churches of our  
order to increase their contributions to the  
funds of the C.S.H.M. Society."

After prayer by Bro. Coddie, ad-  
journed.

## Afternoon Session

One hour was spent in ~~in~~ prayer, and consultation in regard to preaching more definitely the great doctrines of the Bible. Remarks were made by Bros. Atkinson, Dickinson, Blakeslee, Lyman, Knight.

Committee on Education presented a report.

Bro. Lyman introduced the following resolution:

"Resolved - That the idea and practice of the fathers, that education is the handmaid of religion, and that the school and college should go hand in hand with the church, should be a living practical idea with us in Oregon, while laying foundations here."

The resolution was adopted.

The following Committee on Home Missions was ~~selected~~ appointed:

Rev. G. H. Atkinson, ~~Sec.~~  
Rev. Q. Dickinson, Dr. Thos Cordon, Bros  
C. Hargren and J. G. Glenn.

Rev. S. V. Blakeslee gave a statement of the condition of the Pacific, and asked that this ass'n take action as to their sympathy with that paper. Bro. Dickinson was appointed to prepare resolutions on the subject and report in future.

X The question of the local church was taken up and discussed, the discussion touching questions of pastoral labor, and local Evangelization through the efforts of lay members.

The following resolutions were proposed and adopted:

"Resolved - That we recommend churches of our order, when deprived of a pastor, not to forsake the assembling of themselves together, but to meet at regular times and conduct services by singing, prayer, scriptural reading, reading of sermons and religious conference."

"Resolved - That we recommend our local churches to send out committees to visit and invite all families to attend religious meetings and sabbath schools.

The following resolution was reported by Bro. Dickinson, and adopted:

"Resolved - That this Ass'n feeling the importance of some religious paper that is fully outspoken on all the great issues of the day, recommend the Pacific published at San Francisco to the Christian people of Oregon, and we hope that they will give it their hearty support.

"Resolved - That, as we are fully satisfied with Bro. Catherinos conduct of his department, we heartily request him to continue it for the year to come.

Question of the local church being under consideration, the following resolution was proposed and adopted:

"Resolved - That this Ass'n recommend churches of our order when deprived of pastors, not to forsake the assembling of themselves together, but to meet at regular times and conduct services by singing, prayer, scriptural readings, reading of sermons and religious conference."

June 23<sup>rd</sup> 1866

Ass'n met and was opened with prayer  
by Rev. J. H. Wylie.

After reading and  
approval of the minutes, the Ass'n considered  
the question of Sabbath Schools. Remark  
was made by Bros Dickinson, Atkinson,  
Walker, Lyman and others.

The following resolutions were  
adopted:

Resolved - That this Ass'n, feel-  
ing the importance of the Sabbath School as  
a Christian power, commend it earnestly  
to our churches. Some system of visiting  
ought to be adopted for the purpose of ex-  
pressing first an interest in the  
religious welfare of the family;

Secondly of securing the attendance of  
the children at Sabbath School.

Resolved - That the great thought should  
be in the Sabbath School to bring correct  
Bible truth to bear upon the hearts of the  
children. To this end we regard the teacher  
meeting conducted by some competent person  
as a most important if not indispens-  
able part of the work."

The following resolutions were  
adopted:

Resolved - That the Oregon Ass'n  
express their thanks to the A.H.M. Society for  
the liberal aid heretofore granted to our church  
and that we heartily endorse the action of the  
Conf'l Council to sustain their work; and  
that we will endeavor to raise our full  
proportion of the \$300,000 proposed to

raised for their purposes.

Resolved - That in view of  
destitution in our state and adjoining ter-  
ritories, we earnestly request their continued  
efforts for our region.

Resolved - "That this Ass'n cordially  
approve the action of the Cong'l Council in sanc-  
taining by liberal contribution the A.B.C.F.M.  
the Am. Ch. Ass'n and the American Cong'r  
Union."

The following resolution also was  
adopted

Resolved - That this Ass'n appoint  
a standing Committee of two ~~to~~ on the  
subject of Sabbath Schools."

Kev E. Walker and Bro. E. C. Adair  
were appointed said Committee.

The following resolution was pro-  
posed and adopted:

Whereas this Ass'n feels the  
importance of having in this State a  
first class literary institution in sym-  
pathy with Congregationalism, prepared  
to educate young men for all honorable  
professions and to surround them with  
influences calculated to promote their  
spiritual as well as their temporal welfare;

And whereas we are convinced by present  
indications and by our past connection  
with those who control Pacific University  
that by proper encouragement it may  
become such an institution as we require,  
therefore,

Resolved - That we tender our  
hearty sympathy to those who are laboring,  
and who for eighteen years past have  
labored, to build it up, and recommend

it to the sympathy and support of  
all ~~men~~ who value the cause of liberty  
and truth.

Resolved - That a standing  
committee of three be appointed by this  
body to visit said institution at each  
commencement and report their ob-  
servations to this body.

Dr Atkinson proposed the following as an  
amendment to the By Laws, and adopted:

"There shall be a  
standing committee of arrangements, of three  
chosen for three years, the first to hold his  
office one year, the second two years, and the  
third ~~year~~ three years, the vacancy to be  
filled annually by the Ass'n."

After prayer by Bro.  
Atkinson, adjourned.

### Afternoon Session

Opened with prayer and remarks by  
Bro. Lyman.

Report of Committee on the  
state of the country was presented and  
adopted after discussion and amendment.

On motion the committee on the state  
of the country was made a standing committee  
and Bro. Daman was continued as said  
committee.

Committee on the narratives of  
churches presented a report which was  
adopted.

Visiting Committee to Pacific University  
Bros. Dwight, Condon, and C. C. Jerry.

Bro. Walker was appointed Associate delegate to the Evangelical bodies in California in correspondence with us.

Bro. Danner was appointed to present our salutations to the Methodist Conference at Albany.

Bro. Gray was appointed corresponding delegate to the Oregon P. S. Presbytery.

Bros. Dickinson and Lyman were appointed committee to arrange the scriptural texts referred to as proof of our Articles of Faith.

Bro. Harper was appointed to aid in publishing the minutes.

Voted - That the minutes be published in connection with the Articles of faith and covenant.

Teachers appointed for next year.

Associational sermon Rev. J. Condon

Bros. Wright, Lyman, and Dickinson were appointed Committee on business.

The following resolution was adopted.

Resolved - That the thanks of this Ass'n be tendered to the people of Portland for hospitalities extended to our members during the session.

The following resolutions were adopted under the order of Temperance.

(Noted - That the publication committee be authorized to abridge the minutes for publication.)

### Temperance Resolutions:
