The Pacific Boxer took a couple of new forms throughout the year.

A group of students formed a Boxer Fund, which worked to raise money for a new bronze Boxer, the university's mascot. It will be a replica of the 400 year-old Chinese idol from the Ming Dynasty, first brought to Pacific in 1867.

By inspiring classes, organizations, and individuals to compete for its possession, the original Boxer brought spirit to Pacific until 1969 when it disappeared. Kim Smith, Linda Parker, and Janet Leasher were sitting at lunch one

day and decided to start a fund to raise money for a new Boxer. Donations from different organizations, including the Alumni Association, and separate fund-raising activities helped to raise \$800 of the \$1,800 necessary to pay for the recasting of the mascot.

Another face-lift came to the Boxer when a new symbol went before the Senate for approval. The symbol was hoped to be more versatile and recognizable while being used by all the clubs and organizations on campus when promoting their individual activities.
