Dear Mr. Fisher,

I understand you called this office last week to inquire "Why the Rajneesh are allowed to carry automatic weapons."

ORS 166.210 defines a "machine gun" as "A weapon of any description by whatever name known, loaded or unloaded, from which two or more shots may be fired by a single pressure on the trigger device." I assume this is what you mean by "automatic weapon."

ORS 166.250 generally prohibits possession of machine guns and any kind of firearm which is concealed. However, ORS 166.260 sets out numerous exceptions. Among these are peace officers. Pending the outcome of litigation now before the courts as to the legality of Rajneeshpuram's incorporation, that community does have a peace force consisting of persons who have been certified as trained police officers. It appears they would fall within the exception of ORS 166.260, and would be eligible to possess and carry an automatic weapon.

It is true that police officers in Oregon generally do not carry automatic weapons while performing routine duties. However, there does not appear to be any legal reason why they could not.


I hope you understand this letter is for informational purposes only. It does not carry the weight of a ruling by the Attorney General, or the decision of a court.
