
For Fathers' Day, surprise Dad with a new kind of burger:

Sausage Burgers with Grill-Roasted Peppers Serves 4

1 medium red bell pepper

For the burgers:

- 2 pounds coarsely ground pork shoulder
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- 1 teaspoon ground red pepper
- 1 teaspoon ground fennel
- 4 hamburger buns
- 4 slices fontina cheese
- 1 bunch arugula or soft lettuce



To make the burgers: In a small bowl combine the burger ingredients. Add 1/4 cup of water and mix. Shape the meat into four patties of equal size and thickness. Grill over Direct Medium heat until the juices run clear, about 10 minutes, turning once halfway through grilling time. During the last 30 seconds, grill the buns over Direct Medium heat until lightly toasted.

Serve the burgers hot on the toasted buns and top with cheese, grilled peppers, and lettuce.

CHECKS & BALANCES

Fiscal -

THE END OF THE FISCAL YEAR IS JUNE 30th!

There are outstanding purchase orders that need to be taken care of. Please go through any outstanding purchase orders; if you did not use one and will not be using it before June 30th, return it to Fiscal with a note saying you did not use it. All purchase order receipts must be turned into Fiscal, on or by June 30th.

Do not put crossing fiscal year receipts, mileage, etc. on the same green sheet or mileage request forms. Anything for July 1st forward, MUST go on a new request form. You have until July 25th to turn in a green sheet, including receipts, or mileage sheet for Fiscal year ending June 30th, 2008. Anything over 90 days old will not be reimbursed.

By following these instructions, you can get your purchases paid and reimbursements sent out on time.

WHAT'S DEVELOPING?



Community Action celebrated the 10th anniversary of the Community Spirit Awards at the Oregon Zoo Ballroom on Wednesday May 14.

In addition to honoring award recipients of past years, 170 guests recognized 2008 Community Spirit Award winners. Nike received the Outstanding Corporate Partner Award. Legacy Health System Director of Community Relations and Community Programs, Kari Stanley, received the award for Outstanding Business Leader, and the Westco Emergency Fund was given the award for Outstanding Community Partner. Jack McGowan, retiring Executive Director of SOLV and emcee for the first Community Spirit event in 1998, gave the celebration's keynote speech. The Celebration of Community Spirit Banquet, one of two public fundraising events for Community Action held annually, raised \$55,000 for Community Action programs and services

HR - from Nancy

This is a reminder for Pre-K staff getting ready to go on summer layoff. Those of you who have elected to continue working during the summer, as substitutes will have your status changed from

"regular" to "casual on call". This will allow you to get time sheets and a paycheck. Because your hours are being reduced, you will still need to consider whether or not you want to

enroll in COBRA coverage. Working as a substitute does not allow for your health & dental benefits to continue over the summer.

Anyone going on layoff in June will have regular coverage for Health & Dental through the end of June (or if your last day of work is in May, the coverage ends the last day of May). Your portion of the June premium will be paid through your last paycheck. Then your coverage will be stopped. If you enroll in COBRA, the first month of coverage will be July.

Recall letters will go out in August and you will notify the Head Start office if you will be returning. Those who return in September will have coverage reinstated as of September 1st, at the same level of coverage as you had in June. Open enrollment will also occur the month of September that will allow you to make changes in the type of plan, adding dependents, signing new Section 125 forms, W-4's etc.

For those affected, plan on attending the May 30th summer layoff benefits meeting to learn more. The meeting is at Hillsboro main offices from 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. in Conference Rooms 2 & 3.

Beaverton Energy & Emergency Rent Office Update: The Beaverton office of Energy and Emergency Rent is moving to another location in central Beaverton. Our phone numbers should remain the same, and we hope to move by the end of June. We will update you with our new location as soon as a lease is signed!

Tips to keep your A/C bills down this summer: There are simple and easy things you can do as a homeowner to prevent higher electrical bills, and even costly A/C repairs.

- Change out your filters once a month during the summer. This helps to keep dust at bay, and also relieves your unit from having to work overtime to get enough air.
- Clean your A/C unit using a garden hose. Just make sure to shut off the system before spraying. Use low water pressure to prevent damaging the unit and just spray horizontally to clean off the coils.
- Schedule yearly maintenance, which is a good way to make sure everything is in working order. Generally, service runs between \$45-\$90, which is a lot less expensive than replacing a compressor or an entire unit which can run as high as \$12,000.
